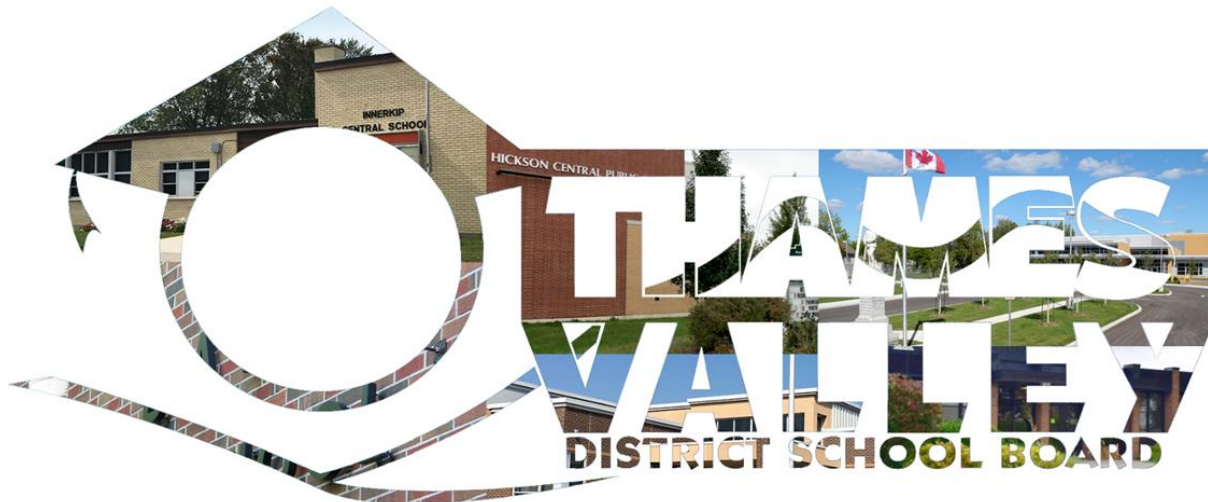

With busing privileges. • Could students impacted move to new schools earlier? • Have you accommodated for future kids that are in the household but not yet in school. • Who is responsible to reach out to families impacted? Can we email and send letters or call directly? • Is the school realistically going to be built by 2026? Could it possibly be done early and what would be the impact. • Is the school going to have portables? If so, why cant we just keep portables in Innerkip.
